

2012 First Year First Term Survey

April, 2013

Results Summary and Four-Year Overview

Overview

First year students were surveyed during their first fall semester for the fourth consecutive year in 2012. As was the case in 2011, students were able to access the survey for slightly over three weeks (October 3rd – October 26th). Despite the comparable length of survey availability, the number of respondents (1,344) and response rate (30.6%) decreased from the previous year's figures (1,511 and 32.4%, respectively).

Although the 2012 survey had fewer respondents, those respondents and their responses remain generally consistent with the prior three years of survey administration. Females continue to be overrepresented, as more female students return the survey than do their male counterparts. However, the 2012 survey saw a higher percentage of males return the survey than any other year. The distribution of respondents among the different colleges continues to remain fairly steady, mirroring the trends of the previous three years. The one noticeable spike is in the College of Engineering, which had a higher number of respondents than any previous year (36.6%) and an eight percent increase from 2011.

This summary includes a four-year overview report that includes information about the survey respondents, as well as their actions and attitudes in several areas. Notable exceptions will be discussed below, but overall, the survey appears to provide a consistent window into the experiences of NC State first year first term students.

Significant Changes in Responses:

- *Missing Class* The number of classes that students indicated that they skipped in 2012 decreased after a three-year high in 2011. 38.1% of respondents said that they missed none (compared to 31.7% the previous year). Accordingly, all other response categories also saw a decline. Although the reported number of classes missed are still higher than in 2009 and 2010 (2009 44.5% said none; 2010 46.4% said none), the 2012 survey does show an increase in class attendance from the year prior.
- Sense of Belonging and Community 52.3% of 2012 First Year First Term survey respondents said that a sense of belonging or community at NC State was very important. While these results are higher than the three-year low in 2011 (47.3%), they are still lower than 2009 (56.7%) and 2010 (60.8%). When asked about the extent to which they experienced a sense of belonging/community at the institution, more 2012 respondents answered a great deal (34.6%) than in 2011 (31.9%). Although this figure is not as high as in 2010 (41.6%), it has returned to the 2009 level of response and indicates a certain level of positive change.

2011 marked the first year that the survey asked a sub-series of sense of belonging/community questions for first year students. As was the case in 2011, the vast majority of 2012 first year students said that it was moderately or very important to have a sense of belonging/community in small groups (94.4%). This percentage was a slight increase over the previous year (93.9% in 2011). Additionally, more 2012 students reported having experienced a sense of belonging/community some or a great deal in small groups at NC State (89.4%, compared to 87.7% in 2011). When asked about the importance of a sense of belonging/community in formal



organizations, 2012 responses were greater than they were the previous year (83% said it was moderately or very important, compared to 79.3% in 2011). The same was true for the extent to which they experienced belonging/community in formal organizations (75.1% said they experienced it some or a great deal in 2012, compared to 72.6% in 2011).

- **Confidence** Students were asked about their confidence in their ability in several areas, and there were a few notable changes.
 - The 2012 survey featured a new question on students' confidence in their ability to use online course management systems. 68.6% of respondents said that they were very confident. 28.3% indicated that they were somewhat confident. Only 3% of first year students said that they were not very confident or not at all confident with their ability to use online course management systems.
 - Fewer students in 2012 reported feeling very confident about their ability to cope with stress by identifying and implementing healthy stress relief strategies (35.2%) than in 2011. This trend of decline reflects patterns seen with all previous years of the first year first term survey (44.7% in 2009, 40.1% in 2010, and 37.4% in 2011).
 - Reflecting similar trends that emerged in 2011, a slightly larger percentage of 2012 first year students reported having less confidence in their ability to relieve or reduce homesickness than in earlier surveys (10.6% said they were not at all confident or not very confident in 2012, compared to 9% in 2011 and 6.6% in both 2009 and 2010).
 - o Compared to all previous years, first year students in 2012 were very confident in their ability to identify at least one campus resource for academic support (64% compared to 51.2% in 2009, 50.5% in 2010, and 56.5% in 2011).
 - The 2012 survey also featured a new question on students' confidence in their ability to identify at least one campus resource for personal/psych/health support. 62.7% of respondents said that they were very confident. 26.6% indicated that they were somewhat confident. Only 10.6% of first year students said that they were not very confident or not at all confident with their ability to identify at least one campus resource for personal/psych/health support.
- Feelings First year students in 2012 were more likely to feel homesick often/constantly (12.2% compared to 11.9% in 2011, 9.8% in 2010, and 10.4% in 2009), more likely to feel overwhelmed often/constantly (35.6% compared to 33.2% in 2011, 24.4% in 2010, and 25.4% in 2009), more likely to feel often/constantly concerned about financial issues (33.1% compared to 31.3% in 2011, 19.4% in 2010, and 19.2% in 2009), and more likely to feel academically underprepared often/constantly (19.8% compared to 16.5% in 2011, 11.9% in 2010, and 13.8% in 2009).

Despite these increases, fewer 2012 first year students said that they did not feel that NC State is not a good fit than any previous year. 86.2% of 2012 respondents said that they felt that NC State is not a good fit never/once in a while, as compared to 84.7% in 2011, 84.1% in 2010, and 80.5% in 2009.

• Actions to Engage with NC State – Students were asked about several areas where they could engage with individuals on campus. In most areas, 2012 first year students had an increase from all prior years. Increases were seen in the percentage of students who answered a great deal when asked to what extent they had made friends with other students, gotten involved in campus activities, developed a relationship with a faculty member, developed a relationship with a staff member, and sought out academic assistance for help with school work. Decreases were seen in the percentages of students who answered a great deal when asked to what extent they had used upper-class students to learn about campus/activities (28.6% compared to 29.0% in 2011, 25.6% in 2010, and 25.7% in 2009).

• Facility Usage – This was the first year that the survey posed a series of questions for first year students related to the frequency with which they used campus facilities or their programs/services. The majority of 2012 first year students said that they use the university student centers a few times a week (43.3%), the Student Health Center never (44.7%), campus dining facilities daily (71.2%), NC State Libraries a few times a week (35.7%), open lounges in academic buildings a few times a week (26.1%), Carmichael Complex a few times a week (46.1%), athletic facilities never (40.3%), outdoor spaces a few times a week (27.5%), the Career Development Center never (62.7%), and residence halls daily (80.9%).
