

2012 Transfer First Term Survey

April, 2013
Overview and Results Summary

Overview

The First Term Transfer Survey was administered for the first time in the fall of 2012 to new transfer students during their initial semester at NC State. Students were able to access the survey for just over three weeks (10/3 to 10/26). A total of 334 students completed the survey, a response rate of 27.6%. Females are overrepresented in the data. The greatest percentage of respondents came from the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS -25.1%), the College of Engineering (COE -22.2%), and the College of Humanities and Social Sciences (CHASS -26.6%).

This summary includes an overview report that includes information about the survey respondents, as well as their actions and attitudes in several areas. Notable exceptions will be discussed below, as will unique points of comparison with first year students.

Notable Information:

- Educational Experience Prior to NC State The overwhelming majority of respondents indicated that they had attended one institution prior to enrolling at NC State (65.6%). Approximately 23% attended two. The types of institutions from which students transferred varied. Despite this variation, two-year community college in North Carolina was the most commonly selected response (N = 205).
- Reasons for Transferring When asked the best reason for transferring out of their previous school, the most common responses were intended major/program not available (31.0%) and wanted to go to NC State initially (31.0%). Accordingly, academic reputation (29.0%) and availability of major/program (35.6%) were cited as the most influential factors in respondents' decision to attend NC State.
- **Sense of Belonging/Community** Although 42.6% of survey respondents said that a sense of belonging/community at NC State was *very important*, only 18.6% said that they had experienced a sense of belonging/community *a great deal*. The level at which transfer students experienced a sense of belonging/community varied (18.6% *a great extent*, 41.3% *some*; 30.7% *a little*). Only 9.5% of transfer students reported experiencing a sense of belonging/community *not at all*.

First-term transfer students also responded to a sub-series of sense of belonging/community questions. The vast majority of 2012 first term transfer students said that it was *moderately* or *very important* to have a sense of belonging/community in small groups (84.1%). However, only 58.4% said that they had actually experienced belonging/community *some* (35.9%) or *a great extent* (22.5%). When asked about the importance of a sense of belonging/community in formal organizations, 58.4% of first-term 2012 transfer students said that it was *moderately* or *very important*. Approximately 39% reported experiencing belonging/community in formal organizations *some* (30.2%) or *a great deal* (9.1%).



- **Confidence** First-term transfer students were asked about their confidence in their ability in several personal and campus-related areas. Their responses were as follows:
 - Although 93.2% of new transfer students said that they feel somewhat confident (48.4%) or very confident (44.8%) about their ability to find their way around campus, the degree to which they felt confident differed from that of first year students. When asked the same question, 70.5% of first year students said that they feel very confident about their ability to find their way around campus. Twenty-eight percent said that they felt somewhat confident.
 - Approximately 32% of first-term transfer students reported feeling *very confident* about their ability to cope with stress by identifying and implementing healthy stress relief strategies.
 Compared to first year students, transfer students expressed lower levels of confidence in their ability to cope with stress (new transfers 23.2% *not very confident* or *not at all confident*).
 - The majority of first term transfer students said that they feel very confident (68.2%) about their ability to relieve or reduce homesickness. In this regard, transfer students appear to be more confident. When asked the same question, 61.3% of first year students said they felt very confident in their ability to relieve or reduce homesickness.
 - Ability to identify at least one campus resource for academic support is one area in which stark differences appear between first term transfers and first year students. Although the majority of new transfer students said that they feel *somewhat confident* or *very confident* about their ability to identify academic support resources (83.2%), higher percentages of first year students responded in the same way (94.2%). The most notable difference is in the percentage of students who responded *very confident* (transfer students 45.8%; first year students 64%).
 - Transfer and first year students also differ in the levels at which they express confidence in identifying ways to get involved on campus. In contrast to 94.5% of first year students, 85.1% of transfer students said that they were *somewhat confident* or *very confident* about identifying at least one activity/group on campus in which they might like to get involved. Similarly, 70.3% of transfer students said that they were *somewhat confident* or *very confident* about identifying a group on campus that supports an identity important to them. When posed the same question, 80.9% of first year students responded in that way.
 - o Transfer students were asked to report on confidence in their ability to identify at least one campus resource for personal/psych/health support. 42.9% of respondents said that they were *very confident*. 39.4% indicated that they were *somewhat confident*. As was the case with their confidence in identifying other campus-based resources, transfer students were less confident than first year students (62.7% *very confident*; 26.6% *somewhat confident*).
- Feelings When comparing the expressed feelings of first term transfer students to first year students at NC State in 2012, a number of differences emerged. First term transfer students were more likely than first year students to feel overwhelmed sometimes or often/constantly (71.3% compared to 66.9%), more likely to feel concerned about financial issues sometimes or often/constantly (68.1% compared to 56.5%), and more likely to feel that NC State is not a good fit sometimes or often/constantly (15.4% compared to 13.7%).

Transfer students were asked to provide information on the frequency with which they felt certain things. The categories examined included: loneliness, homesickness, depression, feelings of being overwhelmed, boredom, concern about financial issues, feelings of being academically underprepared, concern about family issues, and fit at NC State. Of those, transfer students most often struggled with feeling overwhelmed (71.3% – sometimes or often/constantly), feeling concern about financial issues (68.1 – sometimes or often/constantly), and feeling academically underprepared (44% – sometimes or often/constantly).

- Actions to Engage with NC State Students were asked about several areas where they could engage with individuals on campus. In contrast to 86.1% of first year students, 61.9% of transfer students said that they had made friends with other students some or a great deal. In all of the activities explored, transfer students were less engaged than first year students. However, when looking solely at the transfer population and the extent to which they did certain things, the following were done at the greatest levels: getting involved in campus activities (47.5% some or a great deal), seeking out academic assistance for help with school work (44.5% some or a great deal), and using other students to learn about campus/activities (35.9% some or a great deal).
- Facility Usage Transfer students responded to a series of questions related to the frequency with which they used campus facilities or their programs/services. The Student Health Center, Career Development Center, residence halls, and athletic facilities were not highly utilized by transfer students. For each of those spaces, more than half of the respondents had never before used them. Transfer students used the following facilities most often: NC State Libraries (64.8% weekly or daily), open lounges in academic buildings (59.3% weekly or daily), dining facilities (49.8% weekly or daily), outdoor spaces (44.2% weekly or daily), Carmichael Complex (41% weekly or daily), and University Student Centers (35.2% weekly or daily),
