**Executive Summary** 

## **Survey Overview**

The First Year First Term Survey was administered from Monday, October 6 until Friday, October 31 to all new first year students at NC State. This is the sixth year the survey was administered to these students. 4,485 students were contacted and given the opportunity to take the survey and 1,889 unique valid responses were received; a response rate of 42.1% which is substantially higher than the response rate in previous years (response rate was 27.8% in 2013).

There were more female respondents (53.7%) than male respondents (46.3%). Female respondents are over-represented in the sample, as new female undergraduates only make up 45.3% of the population. Respondents were distributed between the academic colleges at NC State roughly in line with the overall undergraduate population. The race/ethnicity of respondents also roughly match the overall population of new undergraduate students with white students slightly over-represented and other races/ethnicities slightly under-represented.
