Survey Results

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Survey Overview

The First Term Transfer Survey was administered starting on Monday, October 3 until Friday, October 28 to all new first term transfer students at NC State. This is the eighth year the survey was administered to new transfer students. The survey was distributed to 1,221 new transfer students and 609 unique valid responses were received resulting in a response rate of 49.9%.

Female students were overrepresented among survey respondents (50.6%) compared to the overall new transfer population (46.4%). The race/ethnicity of respondents roughly matches the overall population of new transfer students with International, Hispanic, Asian, and multiracial students slightly overrepresented and White students slightly underrepresented. Survey responses by college of enrollment closely correspond to first-term transfer students' distribution across colleges with largest differences stemming from students in the Poole College of Management being overrepresented and students in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences being underrepresented.
