

2013 First Year First Term Survey & Five-Year Results

February, 2014
Overview and Results Summary

Overview

First year students were surveyed during their first fall semester for the fifth year in Fall of 2013. As was the case in previous years, students were able to access the survey for slightly over three weeks (October 2nd – October 26th). Despite the comparable length of survey availability, the number of respondents (1,191) and response rate (27.8%) continued to decline from their high in 2011.

Although the 2013 survey had fewer respondents, those respondents and their responses remain generally consistent with the prior three years of survey administration. Females continue to be overrepresented, as more female students return the survey than do their male counterparts. There was some fluctuation in the distribution of respondents among the different colleges, but generally the distribution remained fairly steady with one exception – responses from CALS decreased by more than half while responses from COS (PAMS) increased significantly. This was likely due more to a change in the programs included in those colleges than to a change in response rates for their students.

This summary contains a five-year overview report that includes information about the survey respondents, as well as their actions and attitudes in several areas. Notable exceptions will be discussed below, but overall, the survey appears to provide a consistent window into the experiences of NC State first year first term students. Five-year results tables follow the discussion of the 2013 results.

Notable Information

- Missing Class The number of classes that students indicated that they skipped in 2013 decreased for a second straight year. 45.8% of students reported skipping no classes while 44% skipped one to three classes. These numbers mirror the percentages that students reported in the first two years of the survey (2009 and 2010).
- Sense of Belonging and Community the percentage of students that felt a sense of belonging or community at NC State was very important increased slightly (from 52.3% in 2012 to 56.5% in 2013), while the percentage of students who said that the extent to which they experienced a sense of belonging/community at NC State was a great deal dropped slightly (from 34.6% in 2012 to 32.8% in 2013). However, percentages for both questions were well within the five-year trends.



- Confidence Students were again confident in their ability to find their way around campus, use online course management systems, relieve or reduce homesickness, and identify resources for academic, personal, and social support. They were also again not as confident in their ability to manage their time and cope with stress. The responses to all of these questions were consistent with trends from previous years.
- Feelings First year students in 2013 consistently indicated they were making a smooth transition to NC State. Percentages of students that felt lonely, homesick, overwhelmed, bored, concerned about financial issues, and academically underprepared all dropped from 2012 to 2013. In the cases of feeling overwhelmed and feeling concerned about financial issues, this drop was large the percentage of students that often/constantly felt overwhelmed dropped by 10 percentage points while the percentage of students that often/constantly felt concerned about financial issues dropped 12.8 percentage points. However, despite this drop, more than a quarter of students (25.2%) still report feeling overwhelmed often/constantly, and another third (36.1%) feel overwhelmed sometimes.

The only question that had an increase in the percentage of students experiencing negative feelings was the question about whether they felt NC State was not a good fit, though the increase was minimal. The percentage of students that often/constantly felt this went up from 5.6% in 2012 to 7.2% in 2013. However that is still below the percentages for 2009 and 2011.

A new question was added for the 2013 survey, asking students how often they felt "Very Distressed." Results for this question mirror most of the other negative feelings questions, with 10.6% of students reporting that they often/constantly felt "Very Distressed" and 19.4% sometimes feeling this way.

Facility Usage – This was the second year that the survey posed a series of questions for first year students related to the frequency with which they used campus facilities or their programs/services. Usage patterns were consistent with the 2012 results with a few exceptions. The percentage of students using dining facilities daily increased from 71.2% to 81.9%; the percentage of students that used NC State Libraries daily more than doubled from 22.6% to 47.9%; the percentage of students that utilized Carmichael Complex facilities daily almost doubled from 18.0% to 32.4%; and the use of outdoor spaces went from 20.7% to 35.4%. In most of these cases, the changes in use patterns resulted from decreases in use "a few times a week" and increases in "daily" use.

The percentage of students that had never used the Career Development Center increased from 62.6% to 71.3%, and the percentage of students that had never used the Student Health Center increased from 44.7% to 53.8%, though the latter change may be a reflection on health patterns rather than changing interest.
